REA Executive Order Signed 90 Years Ago Today

90 years ago today, a presidential signature turned 361 words into a movement that would elevate the quality of life throughout the country. President Franklin Delano Roosevelt issued an executive order creating the Rural Electrification Administration on May 11, 1935.

By 1937, according to the United States Department of Agriculture, "the most spectacular increase of rural electrification in the history of the United States had been achieved. ... More than 1.2 million farms had electric service and the gap between urban and rural standards of living was closing. ... And like no other time in history, the economic landscape of rural areas changed."

Today, <u>according to NRECA</u>, there are 832 distribution cooperatives and 64 co-ops that handle generation and/or transmission.
